



Safety on site school assembly

Morgan Sindall led a safety on site school assembly for Key Stage 2 children at Jericho School to highlight the hazards of construction sites as part of our commitment to the local communities in which we work. The school were also keen on the pupils understanding more about safety on construction sites with imminent construction work planned at the school as well as at the nearby high school.

The talk was delivered as an interactive learning experience by Morgan Sindall employees included children trying on Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) in order for them to understand why PPE is so important on construction sites and in everyday life, for example when visiting the local skate park.

The children were encouraged to enter a poster design competition to reinforce the importance of site safety, and were awarded family cinema tickets for the best poster designed.
